## GRAMMAR QUESTIONS on verbs

GROTON: Aperīte hunc librum [GROTON]. In decimō capite huius librī habēmus aliam fābulam mythologicam, dē deā pulchrā Aurōra. Nōmen Aurōrae in Graecā est "Eos"; in Anglicā est "Dawn." [write these names on board] Aurōra amat Tīthōnum; Tīthōnus et Aurōra duōs fīliōs habent. Ūnus filius est Memnōn, magnus Africānus. Memnōn ille, amīcus Trōiānōrum, multās Africānās cōpiās dūcit et in bellō Trōiānō multōs Graecōs vincit. [ASK STUDENTS TO PARAPHRASE/SUMMARIZE, TO BE SURE THEY HAVE UNDERSTOOD THIS INTRODUCTION TO THE READING PASSAGE.]
