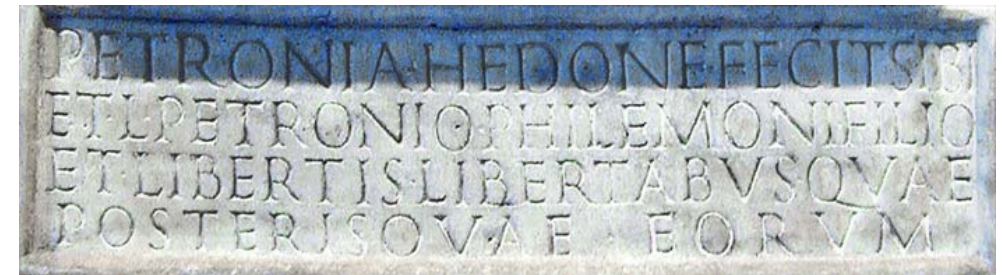
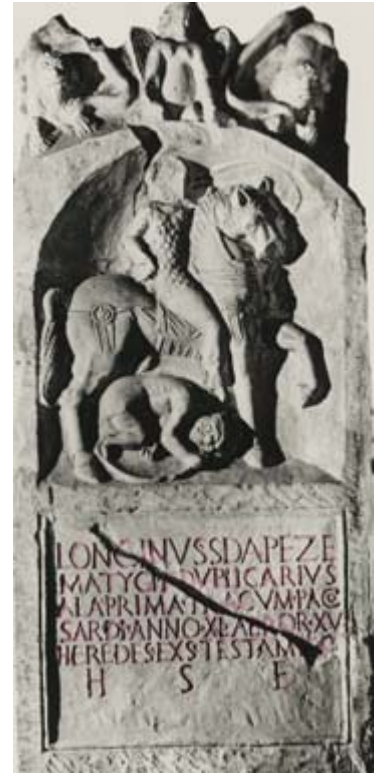

Above: The communal inscription made by Petronia Hedone for herself, her son, her freedmen/women, and their children. It reads:

PETRONIA HEDONE FECIT SIBI ET L[UCIO] PETRONIO
PHILEMONI FILIO ET LIBERTIS LIBERTABUSQUE*
POSTERISQVAE* EORUM.
